PART 3 - Our Choices as VOLITIONAL Beings

As VOLITIONAL beings, it is vital that we each assume **personal responsibility** for the **choices** we make and the **actions** we take.

- Humans, unlike rocks, rats, and robots, are uniquely created with **volition**.
 - We are capable of making choices.
 - We are responsible for our choices.
 - We are free to choose, but not free to choose the consequences.

But in accordance with your hardness and your impenitent heart you are treasuring up for yourself wrath in the day of wrath and revelation of **the righteous judgment of God**, who "will render to each one according to his deeds" Romans 2:5-6 NKJV

So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. For **we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ**, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil. 2 Corinthians 5:9-10 ESV

Now if any man builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, each man's work will become evident; for the day will show it because it is to be revealed with fire, and the fire itself will test the quality of each man's work. If any man's work which he has built on it remains, he will **receive a reward**. If any man's work is burned up, he will **suffer loss**; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire. 1 Corinthians 3:12-15 NASB

For we have spent enough of our past lifetime in doing the will of the Gentiles—when we walked in lewdness, lusts, drunkenness, revelries, drinking parties, and abominable idolatries. In regard to these, they think it strange that you do not run with them in the same flood of dissipation, speaking evil of you. **They will give an account** to Him who is ready to judge the living and the dead.

- Tragically, the **impact** of sin on man's **will** has been **huge**.
 - We tend to choose goals and behaviors that are not consistent with the will of God


All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, **every one**, to his own way; Isaiah 53:6a NKJV

> As it is written: There is **none** righteous, **no**, **not one**; Romans 3:10 NKJV


For **all** have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. Romans 3:23 NKJV

• We usually try to evade personal responsibility for those choices.





• We do all we can to **dodge** or **deny** the **consequences** of our **actions** or **inaction**.



• By God's grace and provision, we can change our sinful and irresponsible behavior.



Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing. John 15:4-5 NKJV

But I say, walk **by the Spirit**, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh. Galatians 5:16 NASB

> I can do all things **through Christ** who strengthens me. Philippians 4:13 NKJV

So then, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your salvation with fear and trembling; for it is **God who is at work in you**, both to will and to work for His good pleasure. Philippians 2:12-13 NASB

No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. **God is faithful**, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation **he will also provide the way of escape**, that you may be able to endure it. 1 Corinthians 10:13 ESV

Implications and Applications:

- Growing Volitional **strength** is a mark of spiritual **maturity**.
- Volitional "muscle" increases with **activity**, and atrophies with **passivity**.
- Since chosen behaviors are in line with chosen goals and desires,
 it's best to distinguish between the two, and deal with them appropriately.

GOAL

An objective that I pursue that is under my control, dependent on my willingness to do certain things.

DESIRE

An objective that I may legitimately and fervently want, but cannot reach through my efforts alone. It requires the uncertain cooperation of another.

I NEED TO ASSUME RESPONSIBILITY FOR MY GOALS

I NEED TO PRAY ABOUT MY DESIRES
